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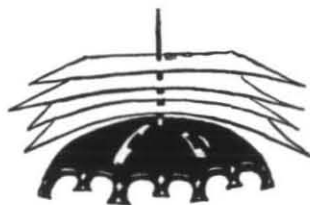
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## off the *Arrow hook*

## *It's "The Happy Way"!*

"ONE CANNOT find any rule of conduct to excel simplicity and sincerity." This is the basis for *The Happy Way of Doing Things*, a reference guide for social usage, distributed by our fraternity in March. The guide is not an attempt to be the final authority on behavior in social situations, but it does offer practical answers to social problems encountered in the collegiate environment.

Compiled by Elizabeth Turner Orr, Director of Standards, and Caryl Lenahan, former Panhellenic Advisor for the University of Georgia, the book uses color and photographs for eye appeal. It is divided into five main sections: How You Look and Act, How You Treat Your Sisters, How You Treat Your Guests, How You Express Yourself, and How You Succeed

in Special Occasions. Thought provoking quotations head up each section.

Although there are references to Pi Beta Phi throughout the material, the focus of the book is such that it is equally valid for any teen-ager or young adult. One full page is devoted to Attitudes for Happy Living.

Copies have been sent to the executive councils of each collegiate chapter, since this is a guide to be used, not relegated to the archives. One copy has been sent also to each alumnae club. Additional copies can be ordered through Central Office.

In compiling the book, advice was sought from Deans of Women, Pi Phi national officers, and several active chapters. According to Mrs. Orr, "It was the happy way of doing things!"

The purpose of the Arrowmont Tour is to show what the school can produce; to interest the public, as well as Pi Phi, in Arrowmont; to promote scholarships; and to increase enrollment in the expanded Art and Crafts School, capable of handling 250 students and scheduled to open in mid-1969. Twenty-nine exhibitors from thirteen states are represented on tour by sixty-four pieces.



# Craft Show Goes On The Road

Sixty-four articles—ranging from wall hangings, decorated fabric, weaving, jewelry, pottery and enameling—are touring the country as a representative display of the crafts created at Arrowmont. These particular articles are from the 1968 Summer Workshop, and represent the work of twenty-nine exhibitors from thirteen states.

Allece Locke Garrard, a member of Arrowmont's Board of Governors, is chairman of the tour, and single-handedly assembled a fine representation of quality articles for the eight month tour. All of the pieces have been carefully catalogued, insured, and fitted into a giant carrying case and four styrofoam-lined trunks, all marked Arrowmont. Packed with the exhibition are blown-up pictures of Pi Phi property in Gatlinburg, architect's drawing of Arrowmont, a colorful collection of Arrowcraft tote bags with wood handles on which to show jewelry, and two red felt display cloths.

Eight Tour Chairmen, conscripted across the country via long distance telephone, promised to guarantee a minimum of three showings in their states, to carry them through with style and standard, and to keep the schedule sacrosanct.

Crafts from Arrowmont have been on the

road since November 1, 1968. Starting on that date at Arrowhead Lodge in Oklahoma, the crafts have been on display in Oklahoma City; the University of Oklahoma and Oklahoma State; Tulsa; Lubbock, Texas; Dallas and Austin; Phoenix and Flagstaff, Arizona; Oakland, Los Angeles, and Pasadena, California; Columbia, Springfield, and Kansas City, Missouri.

A special Christmas exhibition was arranged by the Art Department of the College of the

Southwest, a small college in Hobbs, New Mexico. Two receptions were held, one for the townspeople and one for the student body. The library where the collection was displayed was kept open throughout the Christmas holidays so that everyone in the Hobbs area who might be interested was given the opportunity to see the Arrowmont crafts.

In Pasadena, the showing was a feature of the Pasadena Alumnae Club's annual benefit, and honored members of Grand Council who were meeting there at the time.

Still to be scheduled at press time were showings to be held in New York in May, and in Washington, D.C. in June.



## Weaver To Teach Delinquent Girls

Delinquent girls will benefit from the knowledge that Gladys Dickerson obtained at the 1968 Summer Session of Arrowmont School of Arts and Crafts, our Pi Phi philanthropy in Gatlinburg, Tennessee.

Gladys teaches weaving and related crafts and does some work in occupational therapy at Sleighton's Farm School for Girls in Darlington, Pennsylvania. Having taken weaving at both sessions of the summer Workshop, she feels she has broadened her knowledge and will be better prepared to work with the 150 girls at the school. She is especially looking forward to instructing them in "double weaving" which will enable them to make dresses completely on the loom without any stitching. The girls usually want to keep some of the things they have woven and are allowed to do so within their allowance.

Gladys was recipient of a scholarship given by the Philadelphia-Delco Pi Beta Phi Alumnae Club. In answer to how she heard about Arrow-

mont and the available scholarship, she replied that the Alumnae Club contacted her school and she was selected to attend. The school reimbursed her for the three weeks of vacation time she spent in Gatlinburg, and the scholarship helped financially with her expenses. She is most grateful to the Alumnae Club for their help.

## In Loving Memory

CENTRAL OFFICE to many members of Pi Beta Phi was "national" in a rather impersonal way. When Beatrice Stephenson Purdunn Felmley, Illinois Zeta, our first salaried Central Office Director, was introduced at the 1934 Convention, the office came alive. She had assumed the duties in 1932. She was young, lovely to look at, efficient, and above all, possessed of a warm and outgoing personality.

From then on her circle of devoted friends grew with each of the thirteen years she faithfully served Pi Beta Phi in that position. She first held the office for eleven years. Two years later, when The Fraternity was searching for a replacement, she stepped into the breach and served for another two years. This was typical of Bede's loyalty to her fraternity. She couldn't fail to respond to its need despite personal sacrifice of time and privacy.

She took over the duties at Central Office when it was in its infancy, just five years after her graduation from the University of Illinois. Each year new responsibilities were added, with never a word of hesitation on her part as to

whether it could be done, nor one of complaint that it was too much to expect. Her sense of organization met the need. She assembled an efficient staff and directed it in a businesslike fashion, but with compassion for the individual members that won for her their personal and professional loyalty. Our Central Office of today bears her stamp of executive ability.

Among the varied duties that eventually fell to her lot was the planning and execution of Stunt Night at conventions. She selected the skits, conducted the rehearsals and managed the production. She was manager, producer, casting director, prop-girl, and filled all of the other odd job necessities. It took skill, patience, and a sense of humor—all of which she had in large measure.

Mrs. Felmley died February 25, 1969. Her friends will remember her deep love of Pi Beta Phi, her constant consideration for others, and most importantly, the quality of friendship she gave.

# Mary Swanson Engel Named To National Music Post

Music has been the heart of her activities since early childhood, so it wasn't in her to say "no" to directing Pi Beta Phi music activities when she was invited by telephone to succeed Anne Heflin as National Music Director. Her husband discloses that it took Mary Swanson Engel a full thirty seconds to make her decision, probably just time enough to regain her breath and speak. Music is so woven throughout Mary Engel's life that all activities connected with it are merely extensions of her "favorite thing."

Mary is a happy addition to the central Pi Phi family. She is an attractive brunette with the sparkle and charisma that endears her to all ages from first graders to teenagers, and from current collegians to her peers and elders. Her ability to communicate and relate music to living comes naturally, since she is the music director of the Barstow School in Kansas City, Missouri, an independent co-educational day school of 400 students renowned for their delightful choral work and their annual operetta. She is active in Mu Phi Epsilon and Junior Women's Philharmonic Association of Kansas City, and holds chairmanship of the music section of Independent Schools Association of the Central States.

To keep her constantly aware of the latest musical beat are the three teenagers around whom the Engel's suburban home revolves—son Stephen, 16; daughter Carole, 14; and a guest for the year, 15 year old Marie Adams, a Pi Phi daughter who is living with the Engels so that she can attend the Barstow School. Finally, to exercise the elasticity of Mary's bubbling sense of humor are the family's two favorites, the sedate dachshund and the mixed-hound pup, the latter won at a school carnival and happy to cut teeth on anything.

Mary's path leading to Pi Phi music began when she was four years old and discovered the piano, with lessons from her aunt. A lifelong resident in the greater Kansas City area, she performed often during grammar school, and throughout high school years was accompanist for all of the many music groups in the large

urban school she attended. But she also found time to be advertising manager of the school's yearbook and to achieve membership in the National Honor Society.

At Kansas University, it was the same pattern of life for her—happy hours at the piano, Pi Phi songleader, and Mu Phi Epsilon, with time also for Jay Jaynes, the pep organization. She chose marriage her junior year, and several years later a professional career literally sought her out. Through recommendations of friends to the headmaster, she was appointed to the lower school music department of the Barstow School, and soon was directing the entire music program through 12th grade.

Always active in the Kansas City, Kansas, Alumnæ Club, she served as its president in 1960 and was official delegate to the Hot Springs convention. There she assisted Pat Ballard, National Music Director at that time, with the convention music.

For her new role in guiding and advising about fraternity music, Mary Engel is an apt choice. Already she is deeply in touch with many chapters concerning the song contest for the Pasadena convention in June. Mary's vivacity as she discusses her new musical post with Pi Beta Phi assures that the chapters will enjoy her leadership.



# Determination Is Rewarded

Twenty-two moved out . . .

They said it couldn't be done, but the actives and alumnae of Ohio Beta and the members of the Columbus Alumnae Club did it! Twenty-two actives moved out of the chapter house at the end of spring quarter, 1967: the workmen began knocking out walls and digging a foundation immediately afterwards; and the following fall quarter fifty-two actives moved back into the expanded Phi Phi home at Ohio State University.

Life was hectic for the first quarter in the new house as everyone arose at 8 A.M., packed their suitcases and scurried out of the rooms. The workmen then completed painting, laying the carpet, and installing the built-in chests and desks. Each new room, which accommodates two girls, is unique in its arrangement of furniture and color scheme.

. . . and fifty-two moved in!



The basement and first floor of the house were barren until work on the bedrooms was completed. Toward the end of the quarter, the girls were able to witness all the steps of house construction and remodeling take place. When Pi Phi's returned after Christmas to begin the new quarter and formal rush, they were amazed to find the construction and decorating completed.

With the size of the chapter house expanded  $2\frac{1}{2}$  times, the interior is not only elegant, but it offers the spaciousness which Ohio Beta has long needed. With a color scheme of Spanish red and celery, the addition includes a formal living room flanked by three large pillars which mark off a parquet-floored passageway from the main entrance to the informal and formal dining rooms. The old house has been remodeled to include a lounge, study room, library, chapter office, kitchenette, mail and call room, powder room, and an apartment for our housemother.

The exterior of the original house was of Georgian architecture, which has been preserved in its expansion. The red brick and white trim of the addition will soon, we hope, be covered with ivy which is already creeping over from the old part.

A dedication service was held in April, 1968. Many alumnae have contributed to the building fund, and several memorial gifts have been presented. All Ohio Betas are very proud of their new home.

Mary Ann also made provisions to perform at 1968-69 football and basketball games. She was working closely with the U. of I. band, which accompanies the squad's performances.

During the summer Mary Ann and her group continued to organize so that try-outs for the squad could be held during the second week of school. 425 girls participated in the tryouts, with a squad of 20 girls and two alternates eventually chosen. The new squad worked very hard to learn routines and dances made up entirely by them. They also chose their own name, the Illiniettes.

All of Mary Ann's work was first exhibited at the Dad's Day football game on November 16, 1968. The squad was a huge success and they add unbelievable color to the football field and basketball floor.

Having a mother and a cousin who were Pi Phis, the family home was used as a chapter house for Illinois Beta at Lombard College. Her first taste of college life was at the University of Utah in 1913. Since there were no national sororities there, she joined the local Gamma Phi chapter which later received a charter from Pi Beta Phi.

In her junior year, her father brought the family to Tucson where he taught Latin and

Greek and established our present Humanities program. Margaret entered the University of Arizona and was initiated at last into Pi Beta Phi in March, 1920. After graduation in 1922, she worked in the registrar's office, where she met and married David Albert, a professor of horticulture. Since it was a university policy that only one member of a family could be on the payroll, she started work with the Southern Arizona Bank, and asked to be on the Advisory Board when our chapter was just five years old.

In 1930, she and her husband moved to Tempe, but after his death in 1936, she returned to Tucson with three children, and renewed her interest in Pi Phi as chairman and financial advisor for the Alumnae Advisory Council.

Twenty-five treasurers have been trained under the guidance of Mrs. Albert. She helped establish our Building Fund Corporation and has literally seen our house through its foundations, superstructure and decor. Her success has gone on into other fields as well. She was the first woman to be elected assistant cashier of Southern Arizona Bank. She is a member of the National Association of Business Women and served on its executive council for one year. She also serves as chairman of the financial committee of the YWCA.

One would think that with all her extra activities Mrs. Albert would have little time to devote to her family; however, her successes are abundant in this field as evidenced by the love and respect given her by three children, sixteen grandchildren and two great grandchildren. Peggy, her oldest child, pledged Pi Phi here at the University, and is presently living in Tucson. Her two sons are also graduates of the U. of Arizona.

Margaret Albert is looking forward to becoming a Golden Arrow next year and retiring. We are grateful to have such a wonderfully wise woman here to help us. She is a person whose actions exemplify the true meaning of what it is to be a Pi Phi, and we know that her home and her heart are open to us always.

## Pi Phi Weekend

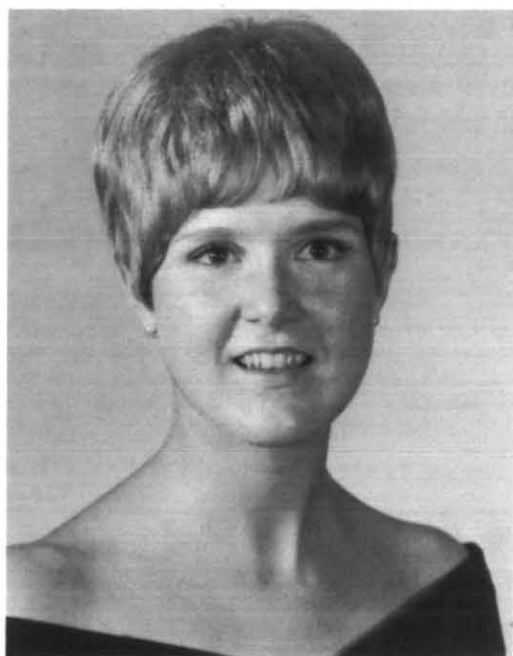

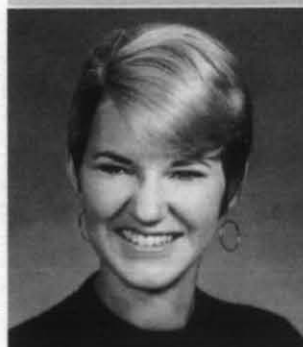

*A supplemental hospital insurance plan*

The almost unbelievable rise in the cost of medical care, especially hospitalization, has led Pi Beta Phi Fraternity to sponsor a new supplemental hospital insurance plan.

The Pi Beta Phi GUARANTEED MONEY PLAN is designed to pay in addition to any other insurance the member may have. The plan pays up to \$20 (or \$30) a day beginning the first day of hospital confinement for up to 500 days for each covered illness or injury (for a maximum of \$10,000 or \$15,000).

In addition, Pi Beta Phi's new insurance program contains a special \$5,000 Cancer Expense Benefit, included with the Guaranteed Money Plan at no extra cost to the insured member.

Members of Pi Beta Phi will receive descriptive literature on the GUARANTEED MONEY PLAN and Cancer Expense Benefit on or about May 15. During the Charter open Enrollment Period (May 15 to June 15) all eligible members who enroll will be issued a Certificate of Insurance in the program.

The Grand Council of Pi Beta Phi has selected as the underwriter of the program Fireman's Fund-American Insurance Companies of San Francisco, California, a 106 year old firm with over one billion dollars in assets. The Administrator of the program is Eliot K. Nymeyer & Associates, Inc. of Chicago, Illinois, specialists in group insurance administration.

The usefulness of this new Pi Beta Phi service can be seen from statistics released by the American Hospital Association which indicate that over-all medical costs have increased 125% since 1946, but that hospital room rates have increased 354%. (Since only 1960 room rates have more than doubled.)

Hospital room rates in many metropolitan areas already average over \$40 a day for a two bed (semi-private) room! In larger metropolitan areas they average as much as \$50 a day - not counting any miscellaneous hospital charges for drugs, lab fees, etc. The American Hospital Association predicts continued increases in hospital charges.

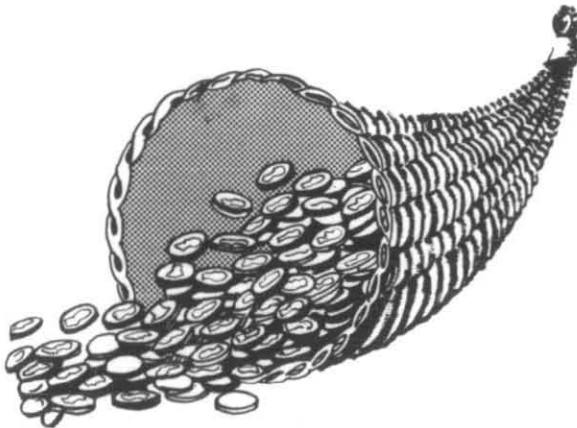
