## FDS500 GRANTS ARE NOW PI BETA PHI LITERACY GRANTS

The FDS500 Grant Program allows chapters and clubs the opportunity to nominate organizations within their communities and make an impact at the local level.

We're excited to share the FDS500 Grant program has been renamed the Pi Beta Phi Literacy Grant program to better reflect our focus on literacy. Pi Beta Phi is thrilled to announce that the number of \$2,000 grants awarded will increase to 75 this year! Nominations for the Pi Beta Phi Literacy Grant program will be open September 15 – October 31. The Local Impact Grants program allows clubs and chapters to direct 25% of their contributions to The Literacy Fund to a literacy-focused nonprofit, matched dollar-for-dollar by a grant from our Foundation. Since the program's inception in 2013, Pi Beta Phi Foundation has awarded \$896,000 in Local Impact Grants. Connect with community partners and literacy champions in your community to identify opportunities to maximize impact. Lean on these experts to inform your chapter's educational programming and philanthropic efforts.

## INSPIRE OTHERS TO JOIN YOU

Share literacy statistics, stories, photos and quotes on your social media throughout the month. You can also reshare content from Pi Phi's social media accounts.

## SHARE THE POWER OF READING

Celebrate what we can accomplish through the power of reading by watching and sharing the "[I AM ONE](#)" video.
