When the Minnesota United Nations Association met in Minneapolis recently to honor Mrs. Eugenie Anderson, Pi Beta Phi was very much in the foreground.

Mrs. Anderson (Helen Eugenie Moore, Iowa Beta) was guest of honor at the Association's reception observing her appointment as United States delegate to the United Nations Trusteeship Council. The event was held in the home of Mrs. Lili Gronna Rice, South Dakota Alpha. During the festivities Mrs. Connie Fegles Adams, Minnesota Alpha, presented Mrs. Anderson with a white orchid in behalf of Pi Phi sorority sisters in the area.

Today Mrs. Anderson refers to "fond recollections of friendships I made at Iowa Beta when I was a student at Simpson College." Two of her nieces, Lydia Sargent Meyer and Barbara Hedin Bayley, are Pi Phis, as are two of her best friends in Minneapolis, Mrs. Orville Freeman and Mrs. Arthur Naftalin, both prominent in the news.

The United Nations appointment continues Mrs. Anderson's long record of public service. She first gained national prominence in 1949, when President Truman appointed her United States Ambassador to Denmark. She thus became the first woman in the history of the United States to attain ambassadorial rank, and embarked on a career which has carried her to positions of responsibility in many parts of the world.

Born in Adair, Iowa, one of five children of a Methodist parson, Mrs. Anderson's early life centered around the typical activities of a small, Midwestern town, and her own intense interest in music. During the years she was completing her education, and during the early years of her marriage, she worked at the pipe-organ and piano, and

was specializing in the music of Johann Sebastian Bach. In 1930 she married John Pierce Anderson, an art student she met while studying a year at Carleton College. After a two-year residence in New York City, where Mrs. Anderson studied at the Juilliard Institute of Muscial Art, the couple settled down to life on a 400-acre farm five miles outside of Red Wing, Minnesota. Two children, Johanna and Hans, were born to complete a model of idyllic life in a beautiful natural setting with emphasis on the arts and the best of simple country life.

During a trip to Europe in 1937, Mrs. Anderson saw Hitler's Nazis parading, and felt the first stirrings of what developed to be an enduring sense of public responsibility. By 1944 both children were in school, and Mrs. Anderson had given herself an intensive training in international affairs. She became active in local politics at the precinct level. Five years later she had achieved political distinction in Minnesota, and had developed political ties with three other Minnesotans still active in public life, Hubert Humphrey, Orville Freeman, and Arthur Naftalin.

Those qualities which helped her achieve success in politics have been needed in her later positions. Attractive and poised, her calm demeanor conceals a well-developed streak of determination. Though soft-voiced, she is an eloquent public speaker, and became known early for being quietly but effectively persuasive.

When President Truman appointed her as United States Ambassador to Denmark, family life assumed a new perspective for the Andersons. Artist John Anderson and the children accompanied Mrs. Anderson to Denmark where residence was set up in a villa formerly occupied by the chief of the Gestapo when the Germans overran Denmark in World War II. The United States had purchased it after the war and redecorated it. One phase of the remodeling of special interest to the Andersons was the plan to convert the air raid shelter into an amusement room for the family.

Mrs. Anderson is remembered in Denmark today as the people's favorite diplomat. She learned the Danish language and made a point of getting out to talk directly to the people, establishing human as well as political contacts. Johanna and Hans attended public school, and the family took up bicycling. The first official party at the embassy after

## Diplomat with a World Conscience

Iowa Beta Pi Phi, Who Was First Woman to Serve as an ambassador, is now United Nations Delegate

Mrs. Anderson arrived was for the eighty Danish workmen, and their wives, who had rebuilt the forty room embassy building. This party established proof of "real democracy" in the minds of the Danish people. American journalists visiting Denmark brought back high praise of Mrs. Anderson's work there, and when she resigned in 1953, she left an enviable record behind her.

For the next ten years the Anderson family maintained residence at the farm near Red Wing, and Mrs. Anderson was called on continually to help with state and national problems. At the request of Governor Freeman she served as the Chairman of the Minnesota State Commission for Fair Employment Practices, launching the work of this Commission in such a way as to gain the confidence of all groups in the state. As a member of the Zellerbach commission she toured Iron Country refugee camps in Western Europe in 1957. She was a member of the American delegation to the Atlantic Congress in London in 1959. In 1961 she lectured for seven months in India under the auspices of the Asia Foundation and the Indian Council of World

In 1962 Mrs. Anderson became the first woman to hold a top diplomatic post behind the Iron Curtain, when President Kennedy appointed her as United State Minister to Bulgaria.

The move to Bulgaria differed markedly from the earlier move to Denmark. The children were grown and would not accompany Mrs. Anderson. Whereas the Danish people had welcomed the Andersons warmly, the atmosphere in Bulgaria was ticklish to say the least. Bulgaria was a loyal Soviet satellite. During the decade of the 1950's the United States

and Bulgaria had not even maintained formal diplomatic relations. The Russian influence was everywhere in Sofia, the 2000 year-old city where the

United States Legation is located.

Indominatably, Mrs. Anderson took up the study of the Bulgarian language and set out to reach the people in this country as she had done in her earlier assignment. She made it apparent from the begin-ning that she intended to do her job with energy and enthusiasm wherever and whenever the Communist regime would permit her to do so. It was also necessary to show that she would stand up resolutely for American interests on every necessary occasion.

In November of 1962 newspapers across the United States carried the story that Mrs. Anderson had walked out of a Soviet reception after Bulgarian President Ganev accused the United States of "piratical action" against Cuba. She insisted on, and received, protection at the United States Embassy during the Cuba quarantine. When the Bulgarian regime found she would not be pushed around, it decided on a more cooperative approach.

On July 4, 1963, Mrs. Anderson scored a triumph by becoming the first Western diplomat to speak on Bulgarian TV, conveying, in the Bulgarian language, "the peaceful and friendly greetings from the American people on the eve of our fourth of

July."

By this time every Western diplomat in the Balkans agreed that Eugenie Anderson had been an active and imaginative minister to Bulgaria, who was known and respected by both the Communist leaders and the people.

She could soon list positive achievements, such as expanded cultural exchange between the two countries; growing contacts at many levels between America and Bulgaria, and a three-and-a-half million dollar settlement of a United States property

claim against Bulgaria.

Looking homeward late in 1964, Mrs. Anderson resigned her post in Bulgaria and returned to the United States, bringing with her a conviction that the Bulgarian people themselves did have good will, affection, and respect for the people of the United States.

When asked about her impressions of college women formed during her travels in other coun-

## Lolita Snell Prouty . . .

## 1966 Convention Guest

The name Prouty has become synonymous with devoted interest and service in Pi Beta Phi. Thus it is fitting that Lolita Snell Prouty is to be honored as

the 1966 Convention Special Guest.

Four generations of Pi Phi in this family began with the initiation of Evalyn Barney Snell into Colorado Alpha in 1885, the first chapter initiate after a charter was granted. Lolita became a Colorado Alpha Pi Phi in 1911 and graduated from the University of Colorado in 1914 with B.A., B.E., and M.A., degrees having completed work on these degrees in four school years and one summer session. She was a Phi Beta Kappa.

Despite her heavy scholastic schedule, she had served her chapter as corresponding secretary and vice president and was quite active on campus. She was a member of Hesperia and Mortar Board, was president of the Women's Athletic Association, president of the YWCA and Associate Editor of the

Coloradan.

She married her Beta Theta Pi sweetheart, Frank H. Prouty of Denver in 1916 and they will celebrate their 50th anniversary this year. Mr. Prouty is one of Colorado's most distinguished engineers.

The Prouty's have three daughters, Evalyn Hickman, Caroline Shreve and Jane Percella, all members of Colorado Alpha. Now there are three Prouty granddaughters wearing the Arrow. They are Tia and Lyn Hickman, Colorado Gamma and Sara Shreve, Colorado Alpha.

Lolita was a member of the Settlement School Committee from 1941 to 1946. She served as Grand Treasurer from 1945 until 1952, when she assumed the office of Counselor for Chapter House Corporation for four years. She has been a member of the

Board of Trustee Funds since 1946.

In 1940, she and her mother and her two older daughters Evalyn and Caroline attended the Pi Beta Phi Convention. She and her three daughters have been in attendance at several conventions since that time and Tia Hickman was with them at Washington in 1962.

This year the honored mother, the daughters and the granddaughters are all looking forward to being

in Gatlinburg together.

Asked to comment on the occasion and Pi Beta Phi's role in Gatlinburg, Lolita said, "I feel very proud to have been invited to be the Special Guest of the 1966 Pi Beta Phi Convention, and very humble too, as I realize I represent so many other Pi Phis who have had love and devotion for the Settlement School and given of their time and effort to further the work in the Gatlinburg community. The foremost of these was Amy Onken, and it was

through my friendship with her that I first developed my interest in and love for the School and was asked to serve on the Committee.

Pi Phi's accomplishments over the years have been many, not only in the field of education, but in health service and the furthering of the craft program which has helped to furnished a livelihood to many families through the development of their native crafts and the sale of their products to Arrowcraft.

For years Pi Beta Phi was also the center of community life in Gatlinburg, enlarging the horizons of the people and enriching their existence. Our health service and nurse gave invaluable aid not only to the babies and children but to adults as well. In the early days we helped the families on small farms to improve their stock and their farming methods by teaching agriculture in our school and having a model farm for them to work in. Through letting children from outlying districts live in our dormitories, they received financial help and training in gracious living, and because of what we brought to Gatlinburg, its citizens have been able to cope with the influx of tourists, and adapt to modern times. All these services brought enlightenment to an isolated community.

Now times have changed and Sevier County and Gatlinburg have become more prosperous and able to finance their own schools, their health center and their community projects so that we can turn our attention away from these things to emphasize our Craft Program which has gained increasing notice over the years with Arrowcraft articles sold by most of our alumnæ clubs, and because of the courses taught in our Summer Workshops to students com-

ing from practically every state. Arrowcraft has become internationally known for the excellence of

the articles produced.

Our facilities at Gatlinburg are ideal for the contemplated enlargement of our Arts and Crafts Program to a year-around school so that our philanthropy can be extended beyond the confines of the community and we can visualize having (with the cooperation of the University of Tennessee) a craft school which will grow until it becomes a foremost Craft Center, known everywhere for the training it will be giving to craftsmen coming from all over the country and returning to their local communities to help in rehabilitation hospitals, schools for retarded children, and to teach handicapped people of all ages to help themselves be self supporting and

able to lead happier, more normal lives.


What finer goal could we have? And how could we be of better service? Too, we will be doing something in an uncrowded field and something other organizations like ours are not doing.

So, I feel especially honored and proud that Grand Council has asked me to be the Special Guest of this Convention, where the Settlement School is the center of interest and where I hope our active girls and our alumnæ will gain a knowledge of services accomplished, foresee what wonderful possibilities there are for the future and be able to carry all this back to the Pi Phis who were not blessed by being present, so that they too, will see the value of our program, give it their full support and be as proud of its accomplishments as it deserves."

tries, Mr. Anderson noted particularly "How much we all have in common—shared human values and hopes for a free and peaceful future." Considering the concern of many college students today with social and political problems, Mrs. Anderson believes "everyone should do the best that he or she can to better human relationships."

Mrs. Anderson's latest post with the United Nations Trusteeship Council has again sent her travelling for her country. Accompanied by her husband, she recently visited Guam and the Pacific Islands Trust Territory with the House Committee on Insular and Territorial affairs. She has set-up residence in New York City, and considers this present as-

signment an opportunity to work for peace and international co-operation, human equality, and all the fundamental problems that confront our country. She feels "a deep responsibility to represent our country here to 117 member Nations of the United Nations, and to work to help our Trust Territory develop towards self-government and self-determination."

The Encyclopedia Americana lists Mrs. Eugenie Anderson as "an American diplomat." To have achieved this distinction in her lifetime, and to have also developed her particular artistic talents, maintained her role of devoted wife and mother, and continued a world conscience which is still leading her to new areas where help is needed, places Mrs. Anderson in a position equaled by few women in any country, at any time.

## St. Louis Women of Achievement include Two Pi Phis

Two of the ten St. Louis women tapped by the St. Louis Globe-Democrat as 1965 Women of Achievement are Pi Beta Phis. Included in that elite group were Alice Wiedmer Wuertenbaecher, Missouri Alpha, and Jane Kuhn Pelton, Missouri Beta.

Mrs. Wuertenbaecher was named Woman of Achievement for Civic Responsibility and was cited as one who has shown an interest in community activities since graduation from the University of Missouri. She is currently a member of the board and executive committee of the St. Louis unit of the American Cancer Society and member of the Missouri Board and state publicity committee of the Cancer Society. She is secretary of the board and a volunteer working with patients at the Rehabilitation Center of Greater St. Louis.

She is a member of the Clayton district advisory committee for Family and Children's Service of Greater St. Louis, and serves on the advisory and membership committees of the Friends of City Art Museum. She was chairman of the latter organization two terms.

She has won high praise for her ability to lead major fund raising drives. In 1965 she was vice-chairman of "Extravaganza '65" which raised money for the burn unit at Barnes Hospital. She has been co-chairman of the drive to raise money to enlarge Children's Hospital and served on that hospital's board. She has held offices in both Heart Association and United Fund drives.

Mrs. Wuertenbaecher calls one of her "nicest experiences" that of serving as president of the volunteer bureau for the Social Planning Council, which trained volunteers for all agencies and did the placing of the volunteer workers.

She was described by the *Globe-Democrat* as one who "has risen from regular volunteer assignments to top leadership positions in most of the organizations for which she has worked."

Mrs. Pelton was chosen Woman of Achievement in Community Service for "decades of service to the community in jobs ranging from two years of volunteer work for the Federal Probation Office to being extremely instrumental in instigating reform at Missouri Hills, the city's institution for delinquent boys."

As an undergraduate student at Washington University she studied architecture and later became one of the first two women to receive her master's degree in architecture there. She won both Sophomore honors and Senior honors at Washington as undergraduate.

Active since 1931 on the Board of the Central Institute for the Deaf, she has served on its scholarship, house, financing and building committees.

During World War II, Mrs. Pelton volunteered with the USO as well as serving as a receptionist at the Officers Club and a Red Cross volunteer.

In 1951 she was appointed to the Board of Children's Guardians of St. Louis and because of her tireless efforts in this capacity, Missouri Hills became a fully accredited member of the National Child Welfare League.

Noting her activities in this capacity, her Woman

of Achievement citation stated,

"At the time of her appointment, she discovered unjustifiable conditions and cruelty to the boys. Jane Pelton and another member of the board fought the battle for improvement, enduring criticism from the public and the board. She even supervised 22 boys overnight when one of the cottage supervisors and his wife quit.

She is presently serving on the Auxiliary Board

of the Division of Children's Services on the Missouri Hills Committee and in related endeavors is a member of the Advisory Committee for the District of Family and Children's Northeast service.

She is in the St. Louis Wesley House Association, which she has served as vice president three times and is now chairman of the program committee for that community center and for Carver House, which is operated by the Association.

She is a member of Pi Beta Phi's Order of The

Golden Arrow.

## Kentucky Beta's New Home

The Kentucky Beta Chapter has recently moved into a new house. Located at the University of Kentucky, Pi Beta Phi has been on this campus for only five years, but from its start, a new house has been the dream of every member. Last fall the dream was realized and became our home.

The outside of the house gives an appearance of grandeur, for it is a large, square brick house with a traditional colonial entrance. There is a sizeable front lawn with a cement walk leading to the door. Inside, the large entrance hall, usually filled with busy girls, reflects the warmth of the entire house. Many times this hall has been used to welcome serenading fraternity men or rushees. This hall is the place where the social aspects of Pi Phi college life begin and end.

The living room is big, but at the same time comfortable and friendly. It is furnished in Eighteenth Century reproductions, and you almost always see people sitting on the couches talking or someone playing the piano. It is the center of activity as well as a gathering place where everyone meets before a chapter function. Hibiscus is the main color of the room and adds to its warmth as does the fireplace. The walls, woodwork, and draperies are the color of rice cloth providing a contrast with the hibiscus. There is a large dining room which seats about fifty girls, and at mealtime, singing can usually be heard as an after dinner relaxation.

An enclosed carpeted stairway from the main hall leads to the girls' rooms upstairs. Forty-four girls live on two floors in two and four girl rooms, each with a different color theme. The rooms reflect the personalities of the girls living in them and are all decorated differently. On the first floor of bedrooms there is also a lounge that can be used as an extra meeting room, for guests, for television, for playing bridge, and various other leisure time activities.

Anything from study halls to parties are held in the all-purpose room in the basement. And sometimes music can be heard during a jam session. This is where meetings are held and many other chapter functions. The basement is not yet finished and we hope to have it wood panelled.

There is much yet to be done, however, for our new home, and the Kentucky Beta's along with their Alumnæ Club are getting it done. We are keeping up a shutter fund to eventually get the thirty-seven pairs of shutters for the outside of the house. The Mothers' Club has contributed greatly to the landscaping.

Realizing this dream of a new house took hard work, elimination, and give and take. It took an entire summer of negotiation just to get the lot, another to decide on an architect, and another year for plans. Then, it was one year more to build the house. But we got the three things we were promised at the beginning of it all—a roof instead of a flat-topped building, closet doors (some sorority houses had to eliminate these), and a staircase in the entrance hall so that when a girl got married she could throw her bridal bouquet from it.

## Indiana Delta House Gets Three Story Wing—

Indiana Delta Pi Phis have enjoyed the comfort of more space and convenience of several new features since January of this year when a \$280,000 three story wing on their house on the Purdue University Campus was completed.

The Journal and Courier, Layfayette daily paper, noted that this wing gave the Pi Phis the distinction of being the first sorority house on campus to have a houseboy's room. It gained that and much more in the well planned and executed building expansion.

The wing, added to the rear of the original house is in Georgian architecture that matches the original design. It was made possible by the purchase of an adjacent lot and this also made thirty-five more parking spaces available.

The new wing includes a dining room, kitchen, and commissary on the first floor; eleven study rooms on the second floor and six study rooms and a large dormitory on the third floor. In case of power failure, the latter area is equipped with standby automatic lighting.

Included in the new basement is the houseboy's room, laundry and storage areas and a new furnace.

The building project included extensive remodeling of the present house to provide new telephone, mail and coat centers near the entrance foyer, where there is also a powder room for guests. A kitchenette was made available for the use of members and the entire house redecorated.

In addition to Layfayette alumnæ who worked on the building program, there were an estimated 45 alumnæ across the country who served as area chairmen in fund-raising activities.


## A Dream Fulfilled

## Albuquerque Scholarship Winner

Cathy Russell, the 1965 winner of the Albuquerque, New Mexico scholarship to the Craft Workshop, has been an art teacher in Alaska and now in New Mexico for the Board of National Missions of the United Presbyterian Church USA. The Church has provided schools in those areas where schools were needed. However, when the State or Federal Government is ready to provide adequate schools in those areas the Board withdraws the mission stations. In the mission school in Sitka, Alaska there were many Eskimos, as well as Aleut and Athepaskan (a northern interior Indian) and several Anglo students from logging camps.

In New Mexico it is the Spanish American with the greatest education need. A small tuition is charged those who can pay and each student is required to participate in some aspect of the work program.

As Cathy writes: "Needless to say, my excellent instructors and the many rich experiences at Gatlinburg this past summer have been invaluable to my own instructing this year. The ceramics which my students have produced show both a respect for the clay, as well as a creative experimenting with the media. I hope to have at least two students work on the one table loom. As weaving is not taught at the University of New Mexico, where I have been taking graduate work, the fine instruction I received in weaving at the Craft Workshop further points out the reason this last summer was so important to me.
