

to school, finding a better job or simply trying something new.

Oliker explains that women, unlike men, continue to make friends, have new experiences and maintain support networks throughout life. She reasons that men's friendships often revolve around activities while women's friendships focus on shared feelings and personal experiences.

Pamela Redmond Satran in her article, "The Evolution of Women's Friendships," (Working Women, November 1989) reports that friendships have taken on a new significance in our lives. "Friends no longer are stand-ins for family; today friendships may be the most intimate, most profound and most durable relationships in our lives. More than family, sometimes."

So as we head into fall, a season of membership drives by both Pi Phi chapters and alumnae organizations, let the light of friendship guide you in your efforts. The friendships Pi Beta Phi nurtures today will live in the hearts of individuals through the years.

Women's style makes friendship good medicine

Friendship has always been something women take seriously. And it is precisely the way women tend to practice friendship that makes it one of the most potentially therapeutic of all human relationships.

Studies of friendship suggest women, typically more than men, tend to invest more of themselves in a friendship. They generally are quite verbal and consider freedom of expression a trademark of true friendship. Among women, good friends also place a high value on "reciprocity," or a willingness to be on both the giving and receiving end of emotional support.

Women reported in one study that close friendship enhanced their capacity to cope with difficult emotions and gave them a person with whom they could express joyful ones. Experts generally agree that friendship contributes to better psychological health. As a source of support, encouragement and comfort, friendship can add to the joy and ease the pain of life events, help smooth the passage through normal transitions and contribute to personal growth for both partners in the relationship.

Historically, women's prescribed and restricted social roles to a large degree determined their circle of friends as well.

Today, as women embark on motherhood, continued education or new career or life choices at a wide range of ages, the great diversity of circumstances in their lives produces a much broader and richer landscape for friendship.

Research also shows that widowed or divorced women traditionally experience a significant "shrinking" of their circle of friends. In one study, many women over 60 avoided potential friendships with men, for instance, because they believed male-female friendship implied romance and they weren't necessarily interested in that. In similar studies, women over 60 considered status a more important aspect of friendship than did younger women, a tendency researchers suggest may result from a diminished sense of im-



portance among women in their later years.

But researchers say that patterns of women's friendships are changing in response to a less rigid society. Women are freer today to build meaningful friendships with whom they please.

As women find satisfaction in new patterns of friendships—non-romantic friendship with men, for instance—they effectively provide models for other women and men searching for the emotional connectedness characteristic of good friendship.

Whatever changes are occurring in society or in women's circles of friendship, research suggests the most women remains the emotional intimacy it offers.

Studies show that men tend to be more external in their friendships, basing the relationship on shared interests or activities, while women base theirs more on shared emotion.

So, female friendship may be less outwardly visible than traditional male camaraderie, researchers say. But they add that the openness of feelings expressed and the mutual give-and-take of emotional support by women is precisely what makes good friendship the best "medicine" of all.

ПВФ Colonizes at Villanova University


Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, home of many historical American traditions ... the Liberty Bell, Betsy Ross, Valley Forge Park and more than 100 college and university campuses, is finally also home to Pi Beta Phi. On February 10, 1990 eighty-two charter pledges and two alumnae initiates brought a new tradition of friendship and history to Pi Beta Phi, Philadelphia and Villanova University.

Since 1934 when the Greek organizations at Swarthmore College were disbanded by the administration, the Fraternity and the Main Line Alumnae Club have been without an active Pi Phi chapter in Philadelphia. The special weekend of February 9-11, 1990 marked the official addition of Pennsylvania Theta to the Pi Beta Phi roll call and history book. The just-published chapter in this book includes a headline announcing the new opportunities now available to the young women at Villanova, the Philadelphia alumnae and to Pi Beta Phi Fraternity.

The first page of the history of Pi Beta Phi at Villanova University was written several months earlier during the colonizing rush in September of 1989. On September 26, more than 300 unaffiliated upperclass women attended an informal meeting introducing Pi Beta Phi to the Villanova community. A national rush team of officers rushed the women and by the end of the week, 90 outstanding rushees accepted bids to Pi Beta Phi. Formal pledging on October 1 at the lovely home of Gamma Collegiate Province President Nan Olin Peterson concluded the first page in the new history of Pi Beta Phi at Villanova.

Subsequent history pages reflect the weeks of pledgeship led by Resident Graduate Consultant Laurie Vaskov. This time was filled with learning about Pi Phi and the Villanova Greek system, preparing for January's formal rush, and getting to know one another. During the second semester, only three weeks prior to the colony's installation,

the charter class of 90 members added 58 pledges to their membership during formal rush at Villanova.

Preparatory events

On Friday afternoon, February 9 Elizabeth Trudeau Morgan and Jeaneen Riely the two honored alumnae initiates, were formally pledged. After the pledging, all gathered for the reading of the Constitution and Statutes by CPP Nan Peterson.

After the dinner break, the prospective initiates traveled to the Stouffer's Inn for the Preparatory Service and the coveted Cookie Shine celebration. The Cookie Shine spread arranged by the Main Line Junior Alumnae Club was

believed to be the biggest Pi Phi Cookie Shine ever. The sheet was composed of 19 individual sheets sewn together and decorated with Pi Beta Phi letters and symbols. The sheet was a gift from the Junior group.

During the Cookie Shine the charter pledges were introduced to the Pi Phis in attendance. A number of traditional ceremonies were performed, the Return of the Pledge Pin, Seven Gifts, and a reading of "An 'If for Pi Phis." The charter members entertained guests with rush songs, skits and the rush slide show. After ceremonies and celebration, all were invited to enjoy the goodies of the Cookie Shine. To conclude the evening, numerous gifts and notes of congratulations and best wishes from Pi Phi chapters, alumnae clubs and individuals were opened, read and applauded.

Initiation

Rain and gray skies on Saturday morning were no indication of the excitement and uplifting mood of the day. Perhaps it was the white dresses and bright smiling faces of the charter members that brought sunshine to the day. The initiation ceremony, conducted by Grand President Carolyn Helman Lichtenberg, was held at the home of Terry Kirkwood. Mrs. Lichtenberg was assisted by Grand Vice President of Membership Carolyn Pavletich Lesh, Grand Vice President of Alumnae Sally Shipley Bowers, Director of Collegiate Extension Kay Cromb Brada and Director of Chapter House Corporations Lou Ann Montgomery Carter. Also in attendence were Executive Director of Central Office Virginia Bland Fry, incoming National Installation Coordinator Barbara Ehni VanLuven, Director of Alumnae Advisory Committees Sarah Ruth Mullis, National Panhellenic Conference Delegate Jean Wirths Scott, Gamma Collegiate Province President Nan Olin Peterson, Gamma Alumnae Province President Eva White Sherman, TGC Amy Bartter.

Banquet

The banquet on Saturday night proved to be a wonderful way to commemorate the initiation of many new Pi Phis and the installation of Pennsylvania Theta. The ballroom of the Stouffer's Inn was aglow, and by candlelight golden angel centerpieces, handmade by Bill Reimer, provided the perfect setting for a Pi Phi celebration. Each guest received a small notepad with the angel imprint as a party favor in remembrance of the historical evening. The meal, preceded by "Pi Phi Grace" and pleasantly interrupted with a chorus of "Ring Ching," brought the room of diverse Pi Phis together in song and feast. This evening brought another record for Pi Phi installation gatherings, with Pi Phis present from 45 different Pi Phi chapters. The most historical moment of the weekend was obvious to all when the newly initiated members of Pennsylvania Theta stood to recite the response of the Fraternity's installation ceremony. The end to the evening came with a nostalgic ceremony in memory of the twelve founders and a celebration of sisterhood through the Loving Cup ceremony.

Model meeting and reception

The Pi Phis awoke to a lovely sunny Sunday morning. Beginning at 10 a.m., the newly initiated Pi Phis entered the East Lounge of Dougherty Hall to take part in their first chapter meeting. With the ritual and chapter officer reports led by national officers, the new active members got a taste for the process and procedure of an active chapter meeting. During the meeting the Grand President installed the 15 colony officers as "official" chapter officers, which included the pinning of the President's badge on Jeannie Corkery, Pennsylvania Theta's Chapter President.

Beginning at 2:00 in the Villanova Room in the Connelly Center, family members, friends, Greeks and faculty members helped the Pi Phis celebrate their initiation and the installation of the new chapter. Again the chapter made some history with another record-breaking count of people in attendance. The room buzzed with excitement and enthusiasm as more than 500 people gathered for a fun-filled afternoon festivity. On the wall of the Villanova Room the new active members were congratulated with a giant poster

with signatures of their 58 new pledges who also attended the reception to meet the national officers and to personally congratulate the new Pi Phis.

Immediately after the reception, the Panhellenic Council and Interfraternity Council of Villanova hosted a dinner for the national officers and alumnae who played a part in bringing Pi Beta Phi to Villanova. Seated in a quaint dining room in the Connelly Center, the groups celebrated the successful beginning of the Pennsylvania Theta Chapter. The dinner may have marked the end of the installation weekend, but it also marked the beginning of a tradition of friendship between Pi Beta Phi and Villanova.

Alumnae initiates

Elizabeth (Betsy) Morgan has a long list of involvement in local endeavors and personifies volunteerism at its best. She has served on the Board and Council of the Junior League of Philadelphia, the Board of the Philadelphia Zoo, and the Board of the National Society of Colonial Dames for the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. For many years Betsy has been a faithful supporter of Arrowcraft sales and is well acquainted with Pi Phi through her mother, Barbara Higham Winner.

Jeaneen Riely is the faculty advisor for the Pennsylvania Theta Chapter at Villanova. She was asked and agreed to take on this position after she hosted an educational program in the fall for the Pi Phis and the men of Sigma Phi Epsilon. Jeaneen has been honored with the Daughter of the American Revolution Leadership Award. She enjoys being involved with Special Olym-

pics, Big Brothers and Big Sisters of Villanova, and Committee for the Homeless of Philadelphia.

University history

Villanova University, a Catholic college associated with the religious order of St. Augustine, was founded in 1842. Located just twelve miles west of downtown Philadelphia, Villanova has an impressive enrollment of 6,400 undergraduate students. Villanova has deep roots in religious tradition and is strengthened through a long established reputation of academic excellence. Today Villanova University can boast of being named one of the top ten all-around private institutions in the nation, establishing the largest organized Greek system of any Catholic university in the nation, and now bringing to its students Pi Beta Phi, the oldest national women's fraternity.

The seven other national Panhellenic Conference women's fraternities on campus; Alpha Chi Omega, Alpha Omicron Pi, Alpha Phi, Delta Delta Delta, Delta Gamma, Kappa Alpha Theta, Kappa Kappa Gamma, are all quite new to Villanova, the first being established in 1980. Together with the 12 Interfraternity Council men's fraternities, the eight women's groups round out a very strong Greek system.

One of the charter members initiated in February summed up her experiences in Pi Phi by saying, "Being a charter member of Pi Phi at Villanova has been an awesome experience. It has become an opportunity to make a difference, to be part of something special and unique. It has been a chance to build a sorority and help make it what it will become."

Pi Beta Phi remembers Holt Family

In places of historical significance, how many times have we heard the phrase "if these walls could talk..."?

Yes, if the walls of Holt House could talk they would certainly relate to us exciting events of another era, of the hopes and dreams of a family who went about their daily routine working and socializing together. This family of two parents and seven children enjoyed their two story white frame house built around 1850. As was the custom of the times, after the Civil War, they took in Monmouth College students as boarders.

The seven Holt children are pictured here in their later years with the walls of the parlor as the background. Shown in this photo are three of the original furnishings of the Holt family that do belong to Holt House today. In the upper left hand corner, if you look carefully you can see a portion of the portrait of Mrs. Holt holding a baby. (That baby is the gentleman seated in the rocker.) The sofa and the mirror are now in the current music room.

The Holt House Committee has also recently accepted several original items from the Holt family. Two mahogany tables, until last year used by Holt family descendants for family gatherings, came to Holt House again in 1989 from California. The first time the tables were shipped to Monmouth (via the Erie Canal) was from West Point where Major Holt had been in charge of feeding the cadets. These tables were donated by Dorry Coleman Parks, a great, great granddaughter of Major and Mrs. Holt. Her mother's grandmother was one of the six Holt daughters, the only one to marry.

Additionally, Holt House has recently acquired some pieces of white china with a gold edge that probably graced these tables. The china was donated by Carolyn Wells Dauner from the Sandhills, North Carolina Alumnae Club.

If these walls and furnishings could share the aspirations and daily lives of its occupants, we would hear stories of everyday success and frustration. However, within these walls one dream was born that outgrew the boundaries of home and campus. This dream of lifelong, enduring friendship now extends "ocean to ocean."

Dedicated Arrowmont worker celebrates her 20th anniversary

Veryl Monhollen has been keeping the books at Arrowcraft Shop for about 20 years, and although the size of the staff hasn't grown much in those 20 years, the work load certainly has. Veryl's job encompasses more than just bookkeeping, and this variety may account for the fact that she's stayed so long. "I do a lot of public relations over the phone and speaking at different places," Veryl said. She has been a visiting instructor at a Sevier County High School home economics class, and she has even helped jury an area crafts show.

"I've enjoyed it. I've gone to four Pi Phi conventions to set up the shop and get it ready to go. We either drive the van or ship the merchandise and fly. It was exciting to see convention. I work with the clubs and talk with the chairmen, but I was thrilled when I finally got to see convention with all the Pi Phis together. They truly, truly are sisters. They really love each other, and it shows that they've got the Arrowcraft Shop and Arrowmont School at heart." Veryl loved getting to see the faces of people she has talked to on the phone. "I think some of those ladies were just as anxious to meet us as we were to meet them. They have talked with us and know our names, and at convention they were able to put a name with a face. They walked into the shop at convention and there we were . . . it's good public relations. Now we feel as though we know them and they know us."

"Working here, has opened some doors and given me the opportunity to be acquainted with people... It's not like any other bookkeeping job." Veryl works closely with shop manager Mary Dale Swan and was interim manager before Mary Dale joined Arrowcraft in 1987. "Faye (Cook) worked with me at that time on the buying of crafts." In short, nearly every aspect of the shop ends up in Veryl's office.


Does Arrowcraft still play an important part in its community after being in operation for almost 65 years? "Oh definitely, because some of our weavers depend on Arrowcraft for their livelihood." Veryl mentioned one weaver whose husband is disabled and her weaving supports them. "Then we have a couple of single ladies that weave. They make their living through Arrowcraft."

By producing for Arrowcraft, the weavers are spared the necessity of purchasing their yarn. "They could not afford to go into production by themselves. Some of the craftsmen depend on us almost entirely. They do sell their work at other places, but we're their major source of income. They sort of rely on us."

It's really a rewarding job to see that Pi Phis still are providing for people. Some of the craftspeople learn new skills at Arrowmont. "They go home, perfect it and bring their work here. That's also rewarding, the fact that both places are so deeply involved—Arrowmont for teaching and Arrowcraft for selling. The two are so entwined."

Rick Stewart, carrying on the family tradition of coopering, teaches classes at Arrowmont

When Rick Stewart was in his mid-teens and just beginning to learn coopering from his grandfather, Alex, he probably never imagined that it would one day make him famous. Today he may be America's only full-time cooper. His name has become synonymous with the art of making cedar buckets, so much so that he gets mail and phone calls for "Rick Cooper." Brooke Shields owns one of Rick's butter churns given to her by "Roots" author Alex Haley who is one of Rick's biggest fans.

At Arrowmont to teach for the first time last March Rick explained, "There are so few coopers left and what I do is very traditional, just as my family has done it for two hundred years. Alex Haley really seems to admire the fact that I'm following the tradition in my family. He had a lot of respect for my grandfather." Rick Stewart was featured in the FOXFIRE 3 volume in 1975 and was a recipient of the National Heritage Fellowship from the National Endowment for the Arts, Division of Folk Crafts. Rick said the fact that he is a fifth generation cooper follows along Haley's line of thinking. He recalled the time Haley first saw some of his cooperage.

It was several years ago. The Museum of Appalachia in Norris, Tennessee was having its annual Homecoming, a four-day music and crafts festival held every October. A crowd had gathered around Haley who was managing to stop at each craftsman's booth for just a second or two. "He held up one of my buckets, and I can remember how he spinned it around and really looked at it." Haley set the piece

down, greeted Rick, and the two were introduced by festival organizer, John Rice Irwin. "Later he started buying my work and writing letters. He wrote me several letters and presented me with many gifts. I see him at all the Homecomings, we keep in contact."

Since then, Rick's cooperage skills have taken him as far away as Japan on a 1988 visit funded by the National Endowment for the Arts. It was a shock because Rick was not familiar with public transportation in any form. "Everytime I went anywhere (in Japan) it was by bus, train, or subway. It seemed so large, with so many people, and such big cities." Rick also commented that the food was a little different, and customs were different. "It's a real, real respectful society," Rick concluded.

A possible trip to Ireland is in the early planning stages, but in the meantime Rick insisted that his studio is open. "I'm glad to share what I do with anyone who comes along. I'm willing to stop work, and I enjoy taking time to explain to people how I make things since so few people really know." That he produces work authentic to his family's style is of great importance to Rick. When folks watch him demonstrate the techniques his grandfather taught him he hopes to give them an understanding, a feel, for what actually takes place. Rick stated, "The finished product should always be a true piece of cooperage in every form, just as my ancestors made it."

Rick's work will be featured in the June issue of "Country Home" magazine.

Friendship is rekindled annually at Arrowmont

Doubtless there are dozens of people who think of coming to Arrowmont, but are kept away by the fear of going there alone. Many people do just that, however, and they make lasting friendships in an atmosphere conducive to getting to know others. Lynn Lavin and M.C. Jerkins are a perfect example. Years ago they met in a ceramics class taught by Meg Ford. They have been meeting at Arrowmont ever since. M.C. said in March, "We plan our vacations to do this together. It's not the only time we see each other, but it's the main time. Lynn lives in Atlanta which is a eight or nine hours from Florence, Alabama."

Lynn joked that in that first class they were "equally inexperienced! Both of us do ceramics as a hobby, so we were at the same skill level." They also claim that their personalities are similar, that they both "go with the flow." "We like the comraderie of the people, the different skill levels, and the fact that you can learn a lot from the students as well as from the instructors," M.C. said.

Both women prefer spring classes at Arrowmont over the ever-popular summer sessions. "Spring is a good time because Gatlinburg is not as crowded," explained M.C. "It's more crowded in the summer, but it's much nicer now."

Lynn and M.C. do have goals in mind and are planning for their futures by coming to Arrowmont every year. M.C. has a husband, three sons, and two part-time jobs, all of which take a lot of time. It doesn't leave much time for clay work at home. M.C. and Lynn both plan to work full-time for only a few more years. Lynn is a manager for a medical instruments company and says that once her house is paid off she won't have to work full-time. Then she can concentrate more on her art work. Until then, she said, "I'm reducing my debt and increasing my skill!"

Is it possible that in a few years M.C. and Lynn will rendezvous while selling their work at crafts fairs? They laughed at the idea and exclaimed, "We may be there together!"

Although Jill earned a B.A. in Fine Arts from Washington State University in Pullman, she says she has been a really naive art person. "I don't know what's out there. I should say I don't know how to tap into it. Being here has opened up doors all over the country through Arrowmont instructors and classmates. I didn't realize how important Arrowmont is. I didn't know what this place offered and how much it gives to people in knowledge and sharing."

After only one full week at Arrowmont Jill said she was already thinking about friends who could benefit from being at the school. "You know, I'm starting to think of people to put on the mailing list. I could tell this person, this person, and this person because they don't really know what's here. I'd say come! The experience of being here would be worth the price. Arrowmont is a nice little community."

"For me Arrowmont is like a hidden little gold mine. I wish I'd known this was here sooner. Instead, I found out two years after graduating when my mom handed me this information. If it hadn't been for that I would not have thought of Arrowmont and I wouldn't know what this place was like."


Three Virginia Epsilons are chosen to live on The Lawn

Maryland-Washington DC Junior Group focuses on the detection and prevention of cancer

The health issues facing women today encompass a variety of illnesses that at one time were considered to be male dominated. One area of concern is the increasing number of newly diagnosed cases of cancer in the female population. These changes in women's health prompted the Junior members of the MD-DC Suburban Alumnae Club to dedicate a monthly meeting solely to the detection and prevention of those types of cancer most affecting the health of women today.

Dr. Ann Burke, a physician volunteering for the American Cancer Society (ACS), gave a talk on the risks associated with each cancer and the techniques recommended by ACS for early detection and prevention. Dr. Burke also showed a video tape demonstrating the three proper techniques of breast self exams. The five most deadly cancers to women are 1) lung; 2) breast; 3) colon; 4) uterine; and 5) ovarian. The risk of each cancer may depend on a woman's age, family history, personal and dietary habits, and physical condition. Early detection of breast and uterine cancer proved to be the most pressing issue for the mem-

bers attending the meeting. The most important message stressed by both Dr. Burke and the ACS is early detection. In most cases, a correlation between early detection hence early treatment and survival rates can be made.

The American Cancer Society provides a variety of public education programs for those people interested in learning more about cancer. For more information about the ACS programs or volunteer opportunities contact your local chapter of the American Cancer Society or call toll free 1-800-ACS-2345.

As a volunteer for the American Cancer Society and a woman in the high risk category for breast cancer, I strongly recommend this program to all active chapters and alumnae groups. Have a volunteer from ACS give a talk at your next meeting. This program is very informative and could help save your life or the life of one of your sisters some day.
